## THE CONSULTATION PROCESS (cover)

## **Purpose**

1. To approve publication of this updated procedural narrative for the Consultation Process used by the SCJC *(Paper 3.1A)*.

# **Background**

- 2. The Council approved the first version of this document at its January 2024 meeting and the main reasons for doing so were:
  - TO RAISE AWARENESS of each of the procedural steps that have been used to build fairness into this management process; and to underpin the delivery of quality outcomes when that process is being used.
  - TO FACILITATE MORE CONSULTATIONS in response to a general perception that the Council should consult more frequently;
  - TO FACILITATE TRANSPARENCY & ACCOUNTABILITY by ensuring that all consultation documents issued, along with the responses received, remain publicly available via the <u>consultation page</u> of the Councils website; and
  - TO MITIGATE RISK as this document provides a key management control to help mitigate the risk of legal challenges being made (for running an unfair consultation or for a failure to promote public participation etc.)
- 3. The updating of this document provides the Council with a quality assurance check on both "the way we consult" and the reasonableness of that process.

#### The changes made

- 4. This updated procedural narrative for the Consultation Process (*Paper 3.1A*) rewords and refreshes the original document; including a more explicit reference (*para 30-33*) being made to best practice in having "due regard" to the five "statutory principles for protecting the environment.
- 5. This updated document (*Paper 3.1A*) also includes a more explicit reference to the duty held under the Aarhus convention that requires the Council to "strive" to promote public participation whenever a pending decision on court procedure may have a "significant effect" on the environment (*para 34-36*).

### Recommendation

- 6. It is recommended that the Council:
  - Considers the content of this revised Consultation Process (*Paper 3.1A*) and approves its publication subject to any stylistic or typographical changes.
